



Exams information 2022 (Year 13)

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- We should expect exams to take place in 2022
- A number of adaptations are being made to support students:
 - Exam boards will provide advance information about the content of exams
 - The information will be provided by 7th February
 - A-Level Art and Textiles students will be assessed on their portfolio only
 - A-Level Biology, Chemistry and Physics students can be assessed against the Common Practical Assessment Criteria using the minimal number of practical activities
 - Grades in 2022 will reflect a midway point between 2021 and 2019
- The contingency plan is for Teacher Assessed Grades to be used



- Your teachers and pastoral staff will help you to prepare for exams
- You have two sets of mock exams:
 - Monday 1st November to Friday 12th November
 - Monday 14th February to Wednesday 9th March (Half-term holiday in the middle)
- The aims of the mocks are:
 - to train you in how to perform at your best in an exam situation
 - to enable your teachers to offer you feedback on how to further improve
- The mocks will only assess on you what you have been taught



UCAS predicted grades:

- The UCAS guidance suggests that predicted grades should be *aspirational but achievable*.
- They recommend using the 2019 grades standard as the basis for predicting.
- They suggest that if a teacher believes that a student is likely to be on the borderline between 2 grades, they predict the higher one

Make sure you have a sensible reserve choice.
